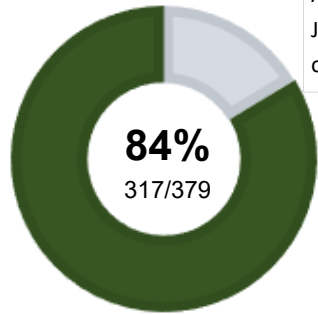

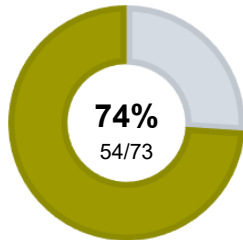
## MDM treatment planning documentation



A record audit of 379 patients diagnosed Jan—July 2017 who had their cancer managed in one of NEMICS member health services

\*DHHS target is 80%.  
Summits and OCPs set higher targets for some cancer types

### PROSTATE CANCER TARGET: 85%



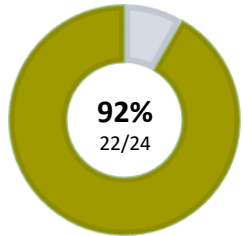
#### 2018 OCP implementation focus:

Achieve 85% MDM target

Ensure men receive decision support for treatment options

Appropriate supportive care is accessible

### OG CANCER TARGET: 85%



#### 2018 OCP implementation focus:

Current 85% target exceeded

2020 target — 100% patients have MDM prior to treatment by 2020

Time to treatment from initial referral into health service

### RECTAL CANCER TARGET: 100%



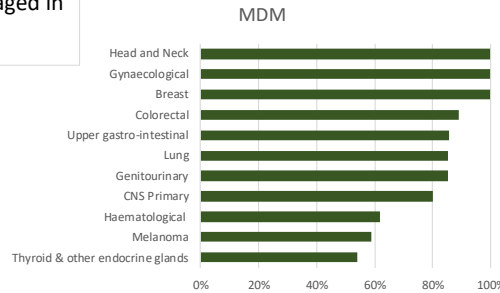
#### 2018 Review CRC Summit

Exceeds 2014 CRC summit target of 95%

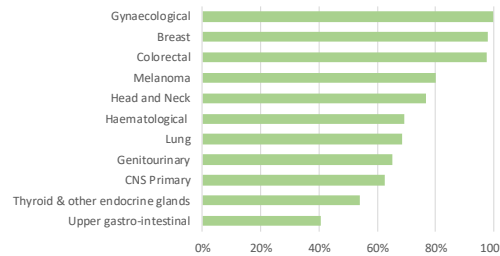
Ensure high quality prospective treatment planning for 100% patients

## Tumour stream breakdown

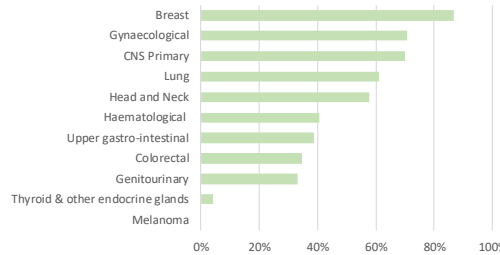
NB Sample sizes proportional to activity and small at TS level



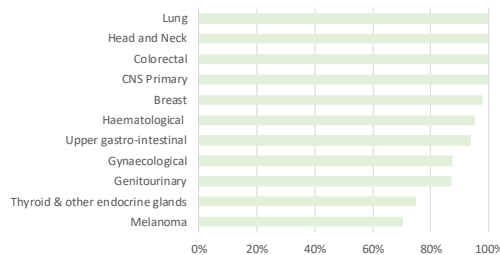

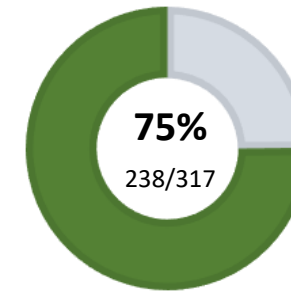

## Staging, communication & supportive care screening

### STAGING IN MDM

TARGET: 100%



The target has not been reached.

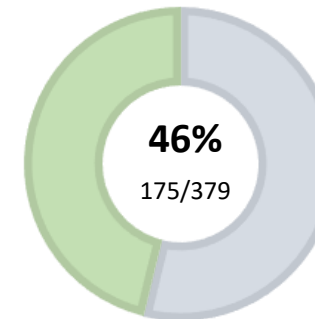
**Two reasons MDM stage is important:**

The most appropriate treatment plan is based on the patient's stage at diagnosis

Provides an electronic data for clinical review and research.

### SUPPORTIVE CARE SCREENING

TARGET: 50%



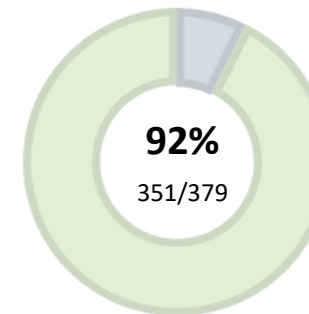
NEMICS is close to target, but patients with some cancer types do not have access to screening as shown in the graph to the left.

A statewide point-prevalence survey of supportive care services was done in 2017.

A review of the education and supports for routine supportive care screening is underway by University of Melbourne

### GP COMMUNICATION

TARGET: 100%



Many of the NEMICS MDTs use CANMAP functions to create and send to the patient's GP a letter with MDM recommendations.

GPs are an integral part of the team caring for cancer patients and need to be informed of planned treatment
